Sample Normal Exam Documentation Documenting a normal exam of the head, eyes, ears, nose and throat should look something along the lines of the following: Head – The head is normocephalic and atraumatic without tenderness, visible or palpable masses, depressions, or scarring. Hair is of normal texture and evenly distributed.

The 411 on Documenting a HEENT Exam | ThriveAP

- The HEENT exam is almost entirely a Tier II exam, based on the patient's complaint. If a complete exam is performed, it should be carried out systematically from top (scalp) to bottom (neck).
- Within each portion of the HEENT exam, the regular examination order is followed: Inspection, Palpation.

PHYSICAL EXAMINATION: On exam, the patient is a very pleasant gentleman in no acute distress.

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He is about 5 feet 6 inches and weighs 210 pounds. His gait is nonantalgic. His tandem walk is normal. HEENT: Normocephalic and atraumatic. Pupils equal and reactive to light and accommodation. Extraocular movements are intact. Oropharynx is clear.

EXAMINATION of the EAR • Inspection • External ear - observe position and shape, inspect for symmetry, lesions, drainage from external auditory meatus • Position: Top of auricle should be above line drawn between outer canthus of eye and occipital protuberance. Low set auricle may signify chromosomal abnormality. • Possible findings

NEUROLOGIC: Examination is grossly normal. PHYSICAL EXAMINATION: GENERAL: He is awake, alert and in no acute distress. VITAL SIGNS: Weight is 11 pounds 11 ounces.
